<b>GCSE</b>	<p>The GCSE exam board for French is EdExcel. The GCSE consists of four papers: Speaking, Reading, Listening and Writing, which are all equally weighted. Students will be entered into either Foundation or Higher tiers in year 11.</p> <p>Topics have been chosen based on the GCSE specification which covers five themes: Identity and culture, Local area, holiday and travel, School, Future aspirations, study and work, International and global dimension. The topics align with students' previous learning at KS3 which will give them all basic knowledge to recall and build upon through the KS4 units. The students have also begun to develop the necessary skills needed to be successful at answering the GCSE papers and so during their two year course they will revisit, build upon and perfect these skills. As all papers will touch on all topics in the specification, students are not taught in 'papers' and so over the two year period students will be revisiting the necessary skills needed for the different papers at regular intervals rather than all at once. More specific exams skills and preparation work for each paper is done intensively prior to sitting the exams in year 11.</p> <p>Students will be assessed throughout the unit through cold calling and deliberate practice tasks. They will also be formally assessed at the end of the unit in their KIP assessment and subject skills assessments. Students will have regular end of topic tests as well as a series of mocks to assess understanding.</p>
