When you arrive at school

The Gate

What we do

-Travel to school in full GA uniform, wearing it with pride.

-Arrive between 8:20 and 8:34, taking pride in our punctuality.

-Show excellence at the gate, saying 'Good Morning ' and making eye contact.

We remember STEPS (Sir/Miss, Thank you, Excuse Me, Please, Smile)

-Use the bathroom before school if we need to. -Speak to our friends in the courtyard.

Why we do it

-We are ambassadors of our school, and demonstrate excellence in the community.

-We value punctuality as there are no wasted seconds at GA.

-We know that manners, and STEPS are important. -We don't waste seconds, so can't use the bathroom in lessons.

-Social time is for socialising, lesson time is for learning.

GA Prep

What we do

-Gates open at 7:15-7:30 students enter via visitor car park.

-Students can take part in a range of different activities from homework (knowledge organiser or SPARX, fitness suit, badminton and just dance. -Student are given breakfast from 8am such as Bagels, cereals and fruit.

Why we do it

-We do it to provide breakfast and extra opportunity to support our students.

Morning Line Up

What we do

-When the first bell goes we start making our way to our line.

-We check our uniform and line up in alphabetical order

-We can continue speaking until the second bell.

-We have one foot either side of the blue line.

-We are silent at the second bell.

- We have hands out of pockets, and outside coats off before entering the building.

-We take pride in our appearance.

-We take pride in our line ups, lines absolutely straight and absolutely silent.

-The second bell signals the end of social time, and the beginning of lesson time. We are ambitious so we waste no seconds.

-We live and breathe our values, we remind ourselves of them every day, these are the things that will get us up our own personal mountain to the best universities and professions.

-Our Achievement Lead focusses on our progress. They support us up the mountain.

-Outside clothes are for outside, inside clothes are for inside.

Morning Checks

What we do

-Our uniform is checked at line up by our tutor.

-Any incorrect uniform is corrected, we swap something for the uniform we borrow.

-Our equipment is checked in our tutor room, we enter, lay it all out, and hold it up when our tutor calls it out.

-Our homework is checked in the morning. We have a detention if we haven't completed our homework.

Tutor Time Reading

Lessons at GA

What we do

-Every lesson starts with a KIP quiz. We write the definition of the key term on our mini whiteboards. We start as soon as we are in the room, in our natural state which is silence.

-We write something for every key term.

-Our books are given out in columns, in silence, as quickly as possible.

-We underline dates and titles.

-We SLANT (Sit up, Listen, Ask and answer questions, Never interrupt and Track)

We SHAPE our answers.

-We work hard, a minimum of one side of A4 per lesson.

-We track when our teacher speaks.

-At the end of the lesson our books are collected in columns, in order.

Why we do

-KIP stands for Knowledge Is Power. Knowledge unlocks doors and is what will get us up our mountain. -We work hard, we never don't attempt a task or a question. -Our teachers are experts, we make sure they can see the work we have done.

-We take pride in our work and how it looks.

Disruption Free Learning

What we do

-We reflect on, and correct, our behaviour.

-We apologise at an appropriate time.

-If disruptive behaviour is repeated, we are sent to the Ready for Learning Centre (RFL) where we complete a day's worth of work, reflect on our behaviour, and get ready for learning.

-We treat staff like platinum showing respect at all times.

-We take pride in our behaviour, demonstrating excellence at all times.

-We use our time in RFL to reflect on our behaviour properly and getting ready for learning.

-We take pride in our behaviour and are rewarded for excellence.

-We receive points in lessons when we demonstrate excellence. These are written on the board. -The best student in each lesson gets the golden ticket. This is for the very best students, and is something to be incredibly proud of.

-Our points are added up each week and we win badges in assembly. We wear these with pride and show them off to our parents.

-We go on rewards visits every unit, depending on how many points we win.

-Attendance matters, we are in school every day, and we can only go on rewards visits if our attendance is excellent.

-GA students are excellent and they deserve to be rewarded for it.

-We like to reward the best, and we like to reward progress.

-We strive for the best because we are ambitious.

-We show off our progress because we are proud of it.

-If we aren't in school, we aren't making progress up our mountain.

-We complete one side of A4 self - quizzing, using 'look - cover - write check' each night.

-We attend homework club at lunchtime if we need support.

-If we miss homework we are referred to compulsory homework club.
